From the Director: Interesting Days In God's Hands



The most recent days at Pregnancy Care Centers of South Central Indiana have been interesting, filled with highs and lows as well as challenges and opportunities.

On the high side, the ministry continues to grow in outreach, meeting people in their time of need. In September, we had over 660 client visits; our highest number ever. Then in October we set a new record for client visits with 675! Our Greensburg center alone had 89 client visits; huge numbers for a center only open 5 1/2 hours a day, two days a week.

These may only seem like numbers on a page, but when you realize every number represents a real person with real needs, it makes you think. In a month's time, 675 people crossed our threshold and were met with the care and concern of Christ just when they needed it most. That makes this ministry a blessing to the one who receives and the one who gives!

Another highlight was our annual joint board and staff meeting where we look at our ministry and dream about where God wants to take us in the future. The meeting was a blessing to both our board and staff. After taking a good, hard look at the current status of the ministry, the board spent quality time determining how to build in the future on the solid foundation that has been laid. You will no doubt hear more about the strategies that grow out of this process, but for now let me just share my excitement about the possibilities God holds for the future of this ministry.

After sharing those amazing highs and opportunities, I can't help but tell you about the challenges and lows. They are mostly related to the financial well-being of the ministry. October and November are traditionally the lowest ebb of our cash flow, and this year has been no different. However, due to some unforeseen expenses incurred this year, our funds have dipped lower than we have experienced in many years. We're facing an interesting predicament because as needs grow and

Vehicle Donation

If you have a vehicle you don't need or want, it is still useful. Pregnancy Care Center accepts donations of cars, trucks, RVs, motorcycles and even boats on trailers. The only stipulations for vehicle donation is the vehicle must have a current title, at least three inflated tires and be free of lien.

With one call, you can make a donation to PCC while easily getting rid of an unneeded vehicle. To arrange pick up for your vehicle, call Valerie at 812-378-4114 ext. 101 or toll-free 866-510-5067 and have ready the make, model and condition of the vehicle. A valid social security number or tax ID number is also needed for tax reporting purposes.

All donated vehicles are sold with proceeds benefitting PCC.

Donors with vehicles valued at or below \$500 may claim the fair market value on their taxes. For deductions over \$500, taxpayers may only deduct the selling price of the vehicle. Average processing time for a vehicle sale is 30 days. Sales receipts are mailed out after the sale is processed.

The Impact of the Church

One goal of the *Transformed* ministry is to equip parents and students to engage with our culture, most specifically the media, in positive and God-honoring ways. Rather than being mindless consumers, we as Christians need to compare God's truths, as revealed in His unchanging Word, with issues raised in the media.

Throughout the *Transformed* sessions, we highlight the impact and influence media can have on our ideas about sex and behavioral choices. A recently released study by the RAND

Corporation linking teenagers' exposure to sexual content on TV and teen pregnancies is an excellent example of how God's truths always play out in real life. The study found high exposure to sexual content on TV to be strongly connected with teen pregnancy even when other factors were considered.

God loves us and gave us His standards to lead us into freedom. It is a privilege to partner with parents in training students to discern truth and equipping them to apply it in their lives. Teenagers are amazing; old enough to be deep thinkers yet young enough to say exactly what they think. I love that! When you have the opportunity to spend time with teens, you're usually able to walk away with many stories to share from the experience. This story is brought to you by a wide-eyed, 16 year old girl from a high school not far from you.

I arrived to class with a bag full of Jolly Ranchers, passion to speak Truth and a head full of facts and data to share with teens. The class was very excited (guest speakers are usually blessed with that!) expecting someone to show up and share on a topic of interest to pretty much anyone over the age of 12. Before the bell could ring, one teenage girl bounced into a back row seat, popped her hand into the air, and before I could

even call on her she asked excitedly, "Are you here to give out free birth control?"

With an excitement to match hers I replied, "Well, YES! Yes I am, but what I have to offer is 100% effective, every single time!" She was skeptical, but as we spent the next 90 minutes together we were able to explore all options and she concluded abstinence outside of marriage is not only free, but 100 % effective and truly in her best interest.

So, did I really say FREE? Yes, it was free to her and the approximately 6,000 other students we presented to this year; but isn't really free is it? This education is invaluable, and though schools, teachers and students are not charged there is cost in executing such programs. Gas for the car, computers and projectors to set up, pens to hand-out; program workbooks to share. It certainly isn't free! This generation is indebted to you for your continued support; because nothing that is valuable is ever really FREE!

As we approach the end of the year, I've been looking through old monthly reports I present to our board of directors. What a blessing it is to be reminded of how God is working in the hearts of our clients. I was also blessed by the wonderful counsel our volunteers give clients.

The ultrasound ministry also ministers to clients. The "window to the

womb" is clearer through the new ultrasound your donations and *Focus on the Family* made possible.

With more features, it is a dream to use. After scanning for vital information, the picture is enlarged for the client showing the heart beating or even the fetus kicking or somersaulting!

Sadly, sometimes we see no heart-beat or other situations requiring medical care. At that time, consultation with Dr. Williams is made and a directive given to follow up with her physician. It

is a blessing to collaborate with community physicians when this happens.

Continue praying for us as we show early, yet viable pregnancies. We don't always know the choice a client will make, but we do educate her.
