## From the Director: God Is Good!



This article is being written as I bask in the glow of our annual fundraising banquets. This year we determined to stay "in house" with our banquet line-up, highlighting the quality of our ministry programs and our people.

The banquet theme, *Impacting Generations*, conveyed the exciting opportunity this ministry has to influence the future with God's message of hope and grace. The positive feedback we have received has been very encouraging. Those who attended one of the banquets got a glimpse of how incredibly blessed we are to have Tracey Pike representing us in our community and Annie Romine mentoring the moms who are some of the recipients of our ministry. The fundraising results of the banquet were very encouraging as well (see *banquet results on page 2*). We are thankful for the partnership of so many faithful people who are called alongside us to affirm the value and dignity of every human life.

Speaking of the amazing ministry partners we have, I must mention the results of the appeal letter sent out in November. Through that letter we explained we experienced several unexpected expenses during 2008, and it placed us in a financial bind. Many faithful partners responded, and when the tally was complete, they had contributed over \$30,000 to put us back on solid ground financially. **GOD IS SO GOOD!**

A further bit of good news came just last month as we were able to finally purchase a portable ultrasound machine to be used in our

satellite centers. This project has been in the works for over a year. Tim Stant, president of TSI Ultrasound in Nashville, Indiana helped identify a new unit that fits our needs perfectly, and several generous donors contributed so we didn't have to spend operational funds to make the purchase. Our intention is to begin using the unit in the Jackson County center in March, then soon after, when our procedures are well established, we will begin providing scans in other centers.

On a final note, the statistical data is in and it is encouraging to see how many people we ministered to in 2008 (see *2008 statistics on page 5*). Our centers welcomed over 6,800 client visits, providing 8.2% more opportunities to offer hope and help than the previous year. Our abstinence programs were presented to nearly 7,200 individuals who received relevant encouragement to swim upstream in this challenging cultural climate. Our post-abortion ministry led 8 individuals through the *Forgiven & Set Free* Bible study, helping them experience the life-changing grace available through Jesus Christ. As I have often said, those numbers can seem a little impersonal unless you realize that each one represents an individual who needed help, encouragement and even rescue. The frequent chorus that rises up from our staff is how grateful each one is for the privilege of being able to help out as those needs arise! For whatever part you have played in making this ministry possible, we thank you.

## Banquet Wrap Up

For four evenings in February across south central Indiana, the ministry of Pregnancy Care Center shared with countless individuals, families and businesses choosing to *Impact Generations*.

Annie Romine, PCC Mom's Mentor, told her testimony of going from a PCC client to staff member. She received hope and encouragement from her PCC counselor and now passes it along to clients she sees through our crib classes. One such client shared her experience and the impact the ministry of PCC made in her life.

PCC Executive Director, Tim Bond, shared the growth the ministry has experienced since 2000 and specifics from last year including the development of three websites: one for clients ([www.pregcarecenter.org](http://www.pregcarecenter.org)), another for those dealing with the after-effects of abortion ([www.afterabortionhealing.org](http://www.afterabortionhealing.org)) and yet another for ministry partners ([www.affirminglifeonline.org](http://www.affirminglifeonline.org)). He also gave a glimpse of future plans including an expanded presence on the Internet and an elementary abstinence program.

To further reinforce how strongly one person's decisions can *Impact Generations*,

keynote speaker, Tracey Pike (*pictured, right*) told the story of how one woman's choice to raise her family to be God-fearing, servant-leaders has passed down through generations and is impacting others today.

The decision of Tracey's grandmother, Goldie Bell Lay, so many years ago has impacted many in her family to serve their country and community in various ways while upholding the truth of God's Word. Her example challenged us to not only aspire to pass along such a great legacy to our own families, but to impact those who want to rewrite their story, but need someone to help them know how.

The income received from gifts and pledges, including sponsorships, at all four banquets totaled more than \$274,000! We give God all the glory! We want to thank those who attended and the banquet table hosts. We are thankful for the help of our dedicated table hosts in recruiting friends and family to join us for the evening.

# NEWS FROM THE ABSTINENCE DEPARTMENT

## Tragic Irony



**D**uring a session of *Transformed* at The Ridge in Columbus, parents anonymously shared what they desire their children to know about sex and their perceived greatest challenge in talking to them. After reading the responses, Randy Gilbert, youth minister, expressed the importance of teens knowing these heart desires and struggles. He said teens should gain the understanding that their parents:

- “deeply care about the decisions they are making.”
- “want them to make godly choices in regard to their purity.”
- “want them to know God’s truths so they can discern lies.”
- “need affirmation that what they are communicating is being caught.”
- “want to talk to them about sex, but find it awkward and difficult to do so.”

Their responses are representative of most Christian parents. In fact, in his book, [Forbidden Fruit: Sex and Religion in the lives of American Teenagers](#), Dr. Mark Regnerus reports a “tragic irony”- religious parents find conversations about sex more

difficult than non-religious parents.

We at PCC are resolved to equip and encourage families to have open, honest dialogues about sexuality. Both *Transformed* and *My Best for You* offer age appropriate opportunities for parents and students to come together to explore what the Bible says about sexuality and how to live out God’s best in our lives. These workshops can serve as a catalyst for or a continuation of life-long family discussions through every age and stage.

In Deuteronomy, God gives us the process for teaching our students biblical values about sex:

*“...God has given us commandments that we are to take so seriously that they become our character. Teach your children the importance of this godly character. Talk about godly character when you are just hanging out at home, when you watch T.V., even when you are in the car, up until the time you go to bed and starting again when the alarm goes off in the morning.”* 6: 5-7, Message

**A** question on anonymous surveys we give students in *Choose to Wait* is: “What parts of the presentation do you feel were most helpful?” Some cite the mind-blowing data about teen pregnancy or Sexually Transmitted Diseases/Infections of which they hadn’t a clue. Others are excited about the entire program and can’t think of just one thing so they write “EVERYTHING!” However, many recount an exercise of making a list of qualities they’d like to have in a spouse and being challenged to date only those with these qualities. They’d never thought of it before; putting pen to paper as to the kind of person they want marry, and only dating someone with those

qualities. It is one of the first practical steps in “equipping” the next generation.

A few summers ago, I had my own teen daughter make “The List.” At first she was annoyed, but then she had fun with it. When completed, she had prioritized the top 10 qualities she desired in a spouse. She felt she had real direction for dating, but after it was completed she was a bit somber. I asked what was wrong, she looked me square in the eyes and said, “Mom, nobody is going to have ALL these!” She felt maybe her expectations were too high. To which I inquired, “Ashley, do YOU have all these qualities?” She self-reflected for a moment, browsed her top 10 list, and replied, “Yes!” It was my pleasure to point out, “Then it’s possible! He’s out there! You just haven’t found him yet!” And a journey of hope was

**T**oday was a good day. I truly believe God plans our day as each client has a counselor who God appoints and equips to minister to his or her needs. We live in such a needy world. Recently, one of our counselors shared with a young gal who had been abandoned by her mother and father as a child, that God never leaves us. This young lady had other needs requiring professional attention and we were able to provide that referral. Her PCC counselor had a psychology background and combined with her faith, she was able to demonstrate the love of Christ with compassion and care. Now that's a God thing!

I praise God for the new ultrasound machine and the new portable machine for use in other counties. I will soon be setting up the ultrasound ministry in Jackson County. Thanks to the help of Tim Stant from Brown County we are about ready to roll! When the ultrasound ministry gets established in Jackson, we will expand to Jennings and then Decatur.

The ultrasound ministry continues to grow and reach a variety of clients. I am finding life goes beyond the active baby we see on an ultrasound screen. God uses this ultrasound to speak life to the mother, father, grandparents, uncles, aunts, cousins and friends. We address the needs of a healthy baby by stressing good prenatal care: no

smoking or other addictive drugs, good diet, prenatal vitamins and prenatal visits with a physician. We look at the client through God's eyes as whole person with physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs.

Again, God used a volunteer when a frustrated and tearful, client was not dealing well with her pregnancy. She was a smoker and on medications that had to be discontinued or changed during the pregnancy. She was not coping well. Our volunteer understood her needs and listened. Because she took time to hear what the client was saying, the client finally felt somebody understood her feelings!

Not long ago, after an ultrasound was completed and I was finishing up the session with a very abortion minded client, she leaned forward and gave me a hug and said "Please don't think less of me if I have this abortion." I reassured her I would not, and I was only concerned for her well-being as I have seen what abortion does to those making this choice. In this young woman's mind, abortion was the best choice, her only choice. I was saddened by this, but we press on, sharing truth in the midst of a world of lies. Time and again, God reminds me to share the words of Jesus in John 10:10, "*The thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy but I have come that you may have life, and have it more abundantly.*"
